



Title: Legacy Glass Mural. 2014
Location: St. Joseph's General Hospital, Vegreville, Alberta
Size: 3 feet by 15 feet

Description: The project is a legacy to the four Sisters of Charity of Notre Dame d'Evron who journeyed to Vegreville in 1910 to care for the sick. The concept is to honour their heritage as well as the community. The tree of knowledge was chosen to be the center point for the design and act as a unifying vehicle connecting the past to the present. The nuns are represented to the left and staff, patients and community members are represented on the right. The mural is colourful and composed of multiple painted layers of glass stains and enamels fired in the kiln. Leaves, light, and windswept lines flow across the commission, and it is intended to inspire and engage contemplation while waiting for treatment and appointments.

The curved panels are mounted out from the wall with 3-inch metal standoffs. Light from side windows shine across the composition creating translucent reflections that move throughout the day and change according to the seasons. The surface of the works is textured and have opaque qualities which give interest to the workday and night.
